IF YOU DON'T HAVE A CARD YET... NOW'S THE TIME TO GET ONE!





SUMMER READING SUCCESS!

WOW! Readers Have Adopted a Wolf at Brookfield Zoo

This year, the Children's Library challenged summer reading participants to read a combined 10,000 or more hours. Previously, the record was 7,945 back in 2011. If kids in Addison could read more than 10,000 hours this summer, a donor would adopt an animal at the Brookfield Zoo in their honor.

Not only did the summer reading participants meet the challenge, they significantly exceeded it! Over the course of our summer reading program, kids read a total of 11,370 hours, a 53% increase over 2013 and our highest level ever. The children chose to be on either the dog team or the cat team for the challenge. Because the dog team read the most hours, a Mexican Gray Wolf was adopted at the zoo. (If the cat team had won, we would have adopted a tiger). Stop in the library to see the adoption papers and a photo of our wolf!

The Friends helped us put together an “emergency” booksale this August when we ran out of room in our stacks and needed to sell some off quickly. Thanks for the help!




