Light Up Your Life

Two years ago Addison resident Irma Tena decided that it was time to make a change in her life and wanted to do something for herself. She decided to enroll in Career Online High School through the Addison Public Library.

The Career Online High School program offers adults in Addison the opportunity to earn their high school diploma, not a GED, online with the support of certified instructors and an academic coach.

"I had enrolled in GED classes through colleges in the past and not succeeded," Irma said. "When I was awarded the scholarship to Career Online High School I promised 'I am going to do my best and am going to finish this.'"

Mayuri Jakate, an Adult Specialist at Addison Public Library, works closely with each student in the program to ensure personal success. Each enrolled student must commit to 10 hours per week to study and complete coursework to earn their high school diploma in 18 months or less. It is no easy feat.

"I actually had to retake some of the tests, Irma says. "Sometimes up to 10 times. When I would struggle, I called my academic coach and got the help I needed. It was such a good lesson for me both as a student and as a mother. I was able to tell my kids, 'Look, mama struggles sometimes, too. You just have to keep trying!'"

Throughout the program, Irma faced her fair share of challenges. "When it came to the math tests I just couldn't get through them on the first try."

"I wanted to do it to help my husband and my family, but most importantly I wanted to do it for me. I wanted to show myself I can be part of the 9 to 5."

After completing her coursework and being the first graduate from the program through Addison Public Library, Irma has earned her high school diploma. Through her hard work and passion, she is now able to embark on her next journey.

Irma is now working as a paraprofessional at Fullerton Elementary School. She loves what she is doing and is planning to continue towards her college degree through online classes. Her dream is to become an interventionist. We cannot wait to celebrate with her when she gets there!




Happy Birthday, Illinois! Bicentennial Birthday Bash



Shining a Light on Positive Relationships

The library has become a safe place for many teens to meet up, make new friends, and hone their social skills. Our programs are often designed to encourage teamwork and help students connect over shared interests. During Hive Lab or summer volunteering, we see students discover leadership qualities they never knew they had. At Anime Club or Gaming, we see lifetime friendships formed.

We also know that many of our teens are struggling with their relationships at home, at school, and online. Adolescence is a period of incredible physical and mental growth, which challenges kids to question who they are and where they fit in. This natural process is even more difficult for this generation of teens, navigating the world of social media.

Research in the fields of education, criminal justice, and child development increasingly point to the essential role that positive relationships play in learning. For teens especially, strong relationships both in and outside of school can have an enormous impact on their academic performance.


Bilingual teens will learn vocabulary and communication strategies to talk with their parents about school, friends, and growing up.




