
When you're logged into your library account, you will receive personalized recommendations based on the items you have rated within the catalog. The more titles you rate, the better your recommendations will be!

Sew Creative: Learning New Skills at the Library



When the library purchased its first sewing machine approximately three years ago, Adult Specialist Rashmi knew exactly how to introduce the new machine to patrons: a sewing class.

“The first class had about seven people, and I was thrilled,” Rashmi said. “But the most thrilling part was that half the class were men which I hadn’t been expecting.”

Most attendees in that first class had their own machines at home, but hadn’t used them because they were afraid of damaging the machines in some way. Rashmi’s class was designed to help them shake their fear.

“I thought, if we can show them simple projects that they can finish in about an hour with no previous experience and have something to take home when they’re done, that would be great,” she said.

After the success of the first class, Rashmi came up with more simple projects for attendees to try like tissue cozies and fashionable clutch purses made from placemats. Rashmi looks back on all these classes with fondness, but a few experiences stand out in her memory.

How the Library Can Help You Keep Your New Year's Resolutions

It's easy to make a New Year's resolution, but they're not always easy to keep. Luckily, your library can help you get started on your resolutions and find tools you can use to make them stick.

Resolution: Learn a Language

You can learn a new language online for free through the library's website. Rosetta Stone works through a computer and offers 30 different languages. Mango Languages offers 71 different languages, and you can use it through a computer or through the Mango Languages app.

Visit addisonlibrary.org/research/learn-language to get started. You can also browse our books and audiobooks to find even more language training.

Resolution: Read More

You already know libraries have books, but did you know we also have eBooks and eAudiobooks? Downloadable materials are perfect for times when you're traveling, commuting to work, or simply staying comfy at home.

Need help finding a book that excites you? Ask one of our librarians for recommendations or use NoveList Plus through our website (addisonlibrary.org/research/fiction-literature) to find something new to read.
