

I decided to try utilizing the slide scanner at the Addison Public Library. The staff was extremely accommodating and took the time to give me instruction on using their program and equipment. After about 15 minutes of instruction, I was off and running... This is a great service our library is offering the residents of our community."

Virgil doesn't make friends easily, but that doesn't mean he can't have them. He is definitely going to need them when he finds himself alone in the forest with the class bully. Unknown to Virgil, his new friends will come in the form of three very special girls who will surprise him with their knowledge and bravery.



Strictly No Elephants by Lisa Mantchev

A small boy with an even tinier elephant finds that he is not welcome in the neighborhood pet club. Instead of giving up, he finds other friends who don't quite fit in. This is a lovely picture book, perfect for family sharing, with a heartwarming message about welcoming everyone despite their differences.

Connecting to a Diverse World

Books have an almost magical ability to transport us to other worlds, other times, and the rich diversity of human experience.

"Connecting teens to places they've never gone and people they've never met through reading is one of the best parts of our job and a duty we take very seriously," says Teen Services librarian, Elizabeth Lynch.

Our Collection Development team works hard to include books from every perspective, and we are always sharing this diversity when we recommend books through displays, at school, or during one-on-one conversations.

Leading up to the Library's World Fest event, we will highlight the places your library card can take you with a week-long Globe Trekker Challenge. Every day after school, students can win prizes by finding materials in our collection from all over the world.

We also know that teens today are growing up in a climate that is especially divided and often hostile. 
