- In 2018, we had an average of 700 visitors per day who attended programs, used our specialized databases, and borrowed our materials.

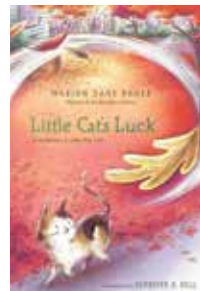

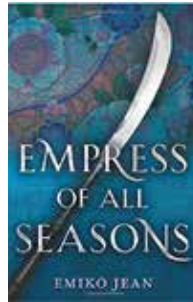

***It's Not Like It's a Secret* by Misa Sugiura**

Sana has secrets, and her family's move across the country only makes them harder to keep. How can she convince her parents and her new friends that she's not in love with Jamie, the girl from the cross country team, when Jamie is all she can think about? And what if someone else finds out about her father's affair before Sana has a chance to confront him about it? When keeping her secrets and her home/school/girlfriend lives separate begins to be too much for Sana, she has to decide who she trusts with the truth. For fans of Becky Albertalli and *To All the Boys I've Loved Before*.



***Empress of All Seasons* by Emiko Jean**

When the land of Honoku needs a new empress, all eligible women compete for the title and for Prince Taro's hand in marriage. To win, a competitor must survive the enchanted seasonal rooms—a challenge Mari has trained for since childhood despite being ineligible as yōkai, a second class supernatural being. Mari doesn't care about the rules or the prince— she competes for the power of being empress, and to bring change to Honoku. Prince Taro doesn't care about his power, and doesn't enjoy being a prize to be won— he would rather spend time in his lab with his mechanical inventions. Together, Mari and Taro could be allies, if they can trust each other when their identities and motivations are revealed. Inspired by the author's Japanese heritage, *Empress of All Seasons* questions the sacrifices made for duty and love, and challenges the notion of tradition as a value to be upheld.

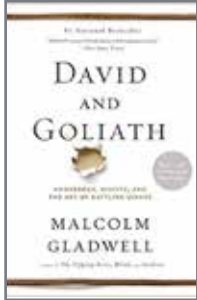
