



Now that construction on the 3^{rd} floor of the library is complete, work is well underway on the 2^{nd} floor! To prepare for the next phase, movers shifted the entire 2^{nd} floor collection to one side so work could begin.

Renovations on the 2nd floor are expected to continue through October, and we're looking forward to sharing the progress with you as it happens!



Main Staircase Closed

Our main staircase is closed for construction! Please use the north stairwell, located near the lobby, or the public elevator to access other floors. Construction is underway for a brand-new staircase that will be located in the northwest corner of the building.

Teen Space Relocated

The teen space has temporarily moved to the Large Meeting Room on the 1st floor while we build a brand-new space on the 2nd floor! We're excited to open the new teen area this summer!

Temporary Computer Lab Open

A temporary computer lab is now open on the 2^{nd} floor. Staff are available to assist you with printing, scanning, faxing, and general computer help.

1st Floor Print/Scan/Fax Services

The print/scan/fax station on the 1st floor is closed during staircase construction. You can print, scan, copy, and fax in the temporary computer lab on the 2nd floor—staff are happy to help!

Creative & Sound Studios

The Creative & Sound Studios are currently closed. Most Creative Studio equipment is available by appointment in the temporary Studio Office on the 1st floor. Some Sound Studio equipment is also available in the temporary computer lab.

Holds Now at Guest Services

Holds have moved from the self-service shelves to Guest Services. Just check in with a staff member at the desk to pick up your items!

What's Happening Next:

Once the west side of the 2^{nd} floor is finished, we'll shift the collections and seating over to that side so construction can begin on the east side! During this time, most 2^{nd} floor study rooms will not be available. We know many of you rely on our study spaces and we plan to have the new study rooms available in late October.





Q&A: Business Services at the Library

We interviewed Business Services Specialist Matt Williams about his work supporting our area businesses!

How do you work with Addison businesses?

One of the key parts of my role is to connect our business owners and entrepreneurs with the tools and resources to help them grow their business in Addison. That could be helping them with getting a library card, accessing databases, hosting workshops and networking opportunities, and more! I also help connect business owners to other community resources like the services through the Village of Addison.

What's something that surprises business owners when you share library resources that are available to them?

Everyone is always amazed by all that they can access at their library! Our business owners have really appreciated having access to a vast collection of databases that they can use for market research and professional development. Often times,

these databases can cost the business owner quite a bit of money, so free access through the library is a huge cost saver. It's also a nice surprise when business owners find out they can do large format printing at the library for a lower cost than printing at a big box store.

Anything else you'd like to share?


