

What do I need to get a library card?

To register yourself or your child for a library card, you need a photo ID with your current address. If your photo ID doesn't have your current address, please bring in an item from the proof of address list at



addisonlibrary.org/get-a-card.

Does it cost anything to get a library card?

Residents of incorporated Addison can sign up for their library card at no cost. Residents of unincorporated Addison may purchase a library card for a fee that will be calculated using your property tax bill. Free library cards are available to any student living in an unincorporated area whose household falls at or below the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Income Eligibility Guidelines. How do I replace a lost card?

If you have lost your library card, please let staff at Guest Services know as soon as possible and they will be happy to issue you a new card for free.

Construction is underway on the 2nd floor, and work on the 1st floor has begun! We appreciate everyone's patience throughout the renovation project — we're in the heart of it and things are happening quickly, but so is the progress!

What's Happening Now?

Teen Space is Reopened!

We're so excited to welcome teens into their new space on the 2nd floor!

Alternate Library Entrance

Our main entrance is closed for construction. Please enter the library using the nearby temporary entrance.

2nd Floor Study Rooms Unavailable

Study rooms S21-S26 are unavailable until November. Study room S20 (now called study room 2A) is open with limited availability.

Main Staircase Closed

Our main staircase is closed for construction. Please use our alternate stairwell or public elevator to access the 2^{nd} floor.

Collections on the Move

The collections on the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} floors have been shifted due to construction. If you need help locating an item, please see a staff member.

Drive-Up Return Closed

While our drive-up return is closed for construction, you can return your items using the temporary outdoor book drop located in front of the library.

Print/Scan/Fax Services

Staff are available to assist you with printing, scanning, faxing, and general computer help on the 2^{nd} floor of the library.

Creative & Sound Studios

The Creative & Sound Studios are currently closed. Most Creative Studio equipment is available by appointment in the temporary Studio Office on the 1st floor.

What's Happening Next:

Our renovated study rooms will reopen in November 2025, when work on the 2nd floor wraps up. Construction on the 1st floor will be underway through May 2026, when we anticipate the project to be finished!
