WHY PARENTS LOVE OUTSCHOOL: FREE CLASSES FOR TEENS

Outschool is an online platform students can use to take a class in something that interests them. For some local residents, the library's offering of free Outschool classes turned into a lifeline: a way for students to keep their brains working while having fun in an upside-down world.

"During the initial lockdown and school closure as well as the summer restrictions and camp cancellations, a class on Outschool provided my kids a fun way to entertain themselves," said Diana Katz. "It doesn't feel like school; it feels like a conversation with a friend who has knowledge and can share that knowledge."

Outschool classes cover a wide range of topics, from theater to forensics to writing to genetics, and so much more.

"Outschool offers so many different classes that are interesting and teach subjects based on today's interests of kids, for example teaching a subject with a Stranger Things or Minecraft platform," said Heather Leslie. "My kids said they absolutely learn something new every time."

Katz said her children gained a lot of confidence through the

classes and had fun learning how to do unexpected things like solve a Rubik's Cube or design fashion with Adobe Illustrator.

Dana Morrow appreciated that Teen Services staff met with her daughter 1-on-1 to learn about her interests to help her wade through the wide variety of offerings and pick something she'd love.

"I love that Outschool customized the courses around what they thought kids would enjoy...and really helped make summer learning fun," she said. "The course variety, ease of navigating the site, the quality of the teachers and the great customer service made me a huge fan of Outschool."


